Attached to this second letter, you find the programme of this year's Swahili Colloquium. As in the last years, the Colloquium will take place in Iwalewa-House, the Africa centre of Bayreuth University (located in Münzgasse 9, see the map on the next page). The Colloquium will start on **Friday**, 3^{rd} **June**, **8.30 a.m**. The admission fee will be $6 \in (\text{for students: } 3 \in)$.

We kindly ask those who have not sent their titles yet to get into contact with us. Furthermore, we would like to ask those who are going to give their presentation in Swahili to send an English abstract to swahili@uni-bayreuth.de till 25th May.

Furthermore, due to the large number of presentations, the time slot for each presentation has been slightly reduced to **25 minutes**: there will only be **twenty minutes** for each presentation, followed by five minutes of discussion.

Apart from three film presentations two further special events will be part of this year's program: on Friday, we will have the pleasure to open the photo exhibition "Von einem Ufer zum anderen – die Karawanenroute Sansibar-Tanganyikasee" ("From one shore to the other – the caravan route Zanzibar –Lake Tanganyika") by Thomas Dorn and Nathalie Carré who followed the old trade route from Zanzibar to Kigoma. On Saturday, a jazz trio from Cologne, M.U.T., mixing jazz, Curdic and Argentinian music, will give a concert in Iwalewa-House.

The day before the Colloquium starts, Thursday 2nd June, we will have a get-together in the Greek restaurant 'Delphi' (located in Badstr. 14, see the map) starting at 7 p.m. We would kindly ask for your understanding that we shall not be able to take care of your bill on that day.

We will soon come back to the students who asked for private accommodation.
