

## **25<sup>th</sup> SWAHILI COLLOQUIUM**

### **Bayreuth, from 18 May to 20 May 2012**

Dear Colleagues,

We would like to cordially invite you to the 25<sup>th</sup> Swahili-Colloquium in Bayreuth: *karibuni sana*.

#### **The Swahili Colloquium**

The Swahili Colloquium has become a well-established forum in Bayreuth. Every year, we invite to this unique colloquium scholars and researchers from different disciplines, who work on various aspects of the language and its culture(s). The multidisciplinary approach and the wide range of contributions from linguistics, literary studies, anthropology and history of the Swahili language and its culture particularly accounts for the appeal of the colloquium. We are always looking forward to welcoming you all including new participants.

#### **This Year's Thematic Focus**

Bayreuth Swahili Colloquium will be 25 years old this year. Therefore, we would like to commemorate the importance of this event of Swahili Colloquium in Bayreuth by inviting participants to write on problems and achievements of the Colloquium in all these years. Also, we are inviting participants to write and present any topic on Swahili language, its linguistics, its literature, its culture and its history based on one of the three concepts we are suggesting, namely *globalization* (utandawazi), *postcoloniality/postcolonialism* (baadaye-(ya)-ukoloni) and *postmodernism* (usasabaadaye). Playing a role of provider and mediator for theoretical models, probes in different research endeavour, and practical situations, these concepts which emerged within these 25 years, have enriched Swahili studies in many ways. Lastly, as usual, we will accept papers based on any theme provided it is based on the analysis of Swahili language, its linguistics, its literature, its culture (this includes ethnographic themes) and history without any reference to the three concepts mentioned above.

#### **Registration**

We would like to ask you to give your paper either in Swahili or English. Each contribution will be granted 30 minutes (including ten minutes of discussion). Please register via email (to [swahili@uni-bayreuth.de](mailto:swahili@uni-bayreuth.de)) and send us the title as well as an abstract of your presentation till **30 March 2012**. If your presentation is going to be in Swahili, we kindly ask you for an abstract in English. Please also register if you merely intend to participate without giving a paper.

## **Location/ time**

The conference will take place in Iwalewa-House, the centre of African studies of Bayreuth University (Münzgasse 9). It will start on Friday, 18 May 2012, at 9 a.m. The conference will end on Sunday, 20 May 2012. Its precise ending is going to depend on the number of contributions.
