Kongamano la Kiswahili la Thelathini na sita

Bayreuth, tarehe 17 Mei hadi 19 Mei 2024

Wapendwa washiriki,

Kwa furaha kubwa tunatazamia Kongamano la 36 la Kiswahili. Asanteni sana kwa ikisiri zenu zenye kutia moyo, makala na mapendekezo ya paneli! Tumeambatanisha programu na jarida hili.

Kongamano la Kiswahili litafanyika tena **Iwalewahaus** (iliyoko Wölfelstr. 2) na litaanza Ijumaa **tarehe 17 Mei**, saa mbili na nusu asubuhi. Ada ya kiingilio itakuwa Euro 15 (wanafunzi: Euro 10).

Siku moja kabla ya Kongamano kuanza, Alhamisi, **tarehe 16 Mei**, tutakutana katika mgahawa wa Kithai 'Hua Hin' (uliopo Ludwigstr. 30; <http://www.thai-huahin.de/>) kuanzia saa moja jioni. Tunaomba ufahamu wenu kwamba hatutaweza kutunza bili zenu siku hiyo.

Pia kutakuwa na matukio kadha wa kadha wakati wa kongamano hilo: **Alhamisi**, tutakutana kwa kusherehekea fasihi ya Kiswahili, tutakuwa na kikao cha kidijitali na kupewa nafasi ya kusikiliza na kuonja kazi za kifasihi za washindi wa Tuzo ya Kiswahili ya Safal-Cornell ya Fasihi ya Afrika. **Ijumaa**, tutakuwa na mhadhara usfunguzi wa Jackie Kosgei. Licha na hayo, siku hiyo tutatafakari juu ya uhusiano wa mapambano ya kupigania lugha na harakati dhidi ya ukandamizaji wa kisiasa. Tutashiriki kwenye mazungumzo pamoja na Ngũgĩ wa Thiong'o kuhusu *Decolonizing the Mind*. Mara baada ya hapo, tutazindua kitabu *The Imaginative Vision of Abdilatif Abdalla's Voice of Agony*, tafsiri ya diwani *Sauti ya Dhiki*, iliyotafsiriwa na Ken Walibora na kuhaririwa na Annmarie Drury. Wachangiaji wengine wa kitabu hicho, wakiwemo Ngũgĩ wa Thiong'o, Alamin Mazrui, Ann Biersteker, Meg Arenberg, Kai Kresse na mhariri wa mfululizo wa vitabu Kelly Askew, watashiriki vilevile. Siku ya **Jumamosi** kutakuwa na hotuba

kuu ya Alamin Mazrui. Licha ya hayo, siku ile pia tumeitenga kusherehekea muziki kwa ajili ya uzinduzi wa kitabu cha Andrew Eisenberg *Sounds of Other Shores. The Musical Poetics of Identity on Kenya's Swahili Coast*, ambacho kitachanganuliwa na Kai Kresse na Farouk Topan. Halafu, tutawapelekeni Unguja enzi kabla ya ukoloni kwa maonyesho ya filamu "Muhali" ambayo itafafanuliwa na mkurugenzi wa filamu na mwanamuziki wa taarab Mariam Hamdani. Mwishoni tutaendelea kusherehekea na kufurahia muziki na DJ Ismail. Pia tutakuwa na paneli mbili za kuvutia zilizonpendekeza na kwanza, Nathalie Carré, Florence Wenzek, Pierre Leroux and Aurélie Journo, na, pili, Roberto Gaudioso, Emiliano Minerba and Aaron Rosenberg. Wakati wote wa Kongamano kutakuwepo 'soko la vitabu', kwa hivyo mnakaribishwa kuonyesha vitabu vyenu na kufurahia fasihi ya Kiswahili.

Tunafurahi sana kwamba tunaweza kukutana tena ana kwa ana. Kwa wale, wanaotaka kujiunga nasi mtandaoni, tafadhali, tuma barua pepe kwa swahili@uni-bayreuth.de Washiriki ambao watahuduria Bayreuth watapewa kipaumbele. Dear colleagues,

We are very much looking forward to this year's **Swahili Colloquium** from 17th until 19th May 2024. Thank you very much for your many inspiring abstracts, papers and panel proposals! Please find the preliminary programme attached to this newsletter.

The Swahili Colloquium will take place in **Iwalewahaus** (located in Wölfelstr. 2) and will start on **Friday 17th May**, 8.30 a.m. The admission fee will be 15 Euro (students: 10 Euro).

The day before the Colloquium starts, on **Thursday, 16th May**, we will have a get-together in the Thai restaurant 'Hua Hin' (located in Ludwigstr. 30; <http://www.thai-huahin.de/>) starting at 7 p.m. We kindly ask for your understanding that we will not be able to take care of your bill on that day.

There will also be several events during the conference: On **Thursday**, we will meet to celebrate Swahili literature, we will host a digital event and will have the possibility to listen to and taste the literary works of the winners of the Safal-Cornell Kiswahili Prize for African Literature. On **Friday**, there will be the opening lecture by Jacky Kosgei. In addition to this, we will consider the entangled struggle for language and against political domination. We will start by engaging in a conversation with Ngũgĩ wa Thiong'o about Decolonizing the Mind. Right afterward, we will have the book launch of *The Imaginative Vision of Abdilatif Abdalla's Voice of Agony*, the translation of the Swahili poetry collection *Sauti ya Dhiki*, translated by Ken Walibora and edited by Annmarie Drury. The other contributors to the book including Ngũgĩ wa Thiong'o, Alamin Mazrui, Ann Biersteker, Meg Arenberg, Kai Kresse, and the editor of the book series, Kelly Askew, will also be part of it. On **Saturday** there will be the Keynote by Alamin Mazrui. Furthermore, that day will be dedicated to music, as there will be the book

launch of Andrew Eisenberg's *Sounds of Other Shores. The Musical Poetics of Identity on Kenya's Swahili Coast*, which both Kai Kresse and Farouk Topan will discuss. Afterwards, we will take you to precolonial Zanzibar with the screening of the film "Muhali" introduced by the director and taarab musician Mariam Hamdani. We will continue celebrating and enjoying music with a DJ night with DJ Ismail. Furthermore we will also host two interesting panels organized by, firstly, Nathalie Carré, Florence Wenzek, Pierre Leroux and Aurélie Journo, and secondly, Roberto Gaudioso, Emiliano Minerba and Aaron Rosenberg. During the Colloquium there will be a 'book market': you are welcome to display your books and enjoy Swahili literature!

We are really happy to meet again in person. For those, who want to join us online, please, send an email to swahili@uni-bayreuth.de We do give priority to contributors presenting on site. However, if you need to present online, please, let us know in advance until latest 1st May.
