From the 'Prose Writing' category, Zainab Alwi Baharoon will read from his novel *Mungu Hakopeshwi* and from the 'Poetry' category, Jacob Ngumbau Julius will read from his anthology *Moto wa Kifuu*.

There will be a panel "Sociolinguistic variation and change in Kiswahili: Creative practices, playful language, translocal communication" planned by Nico Nassenstein and Andrea Hollington and the panel "Baina Pwani na Bahari: Indian Ocean Networks" organized by Annachiara Raia and Clarissa Vierke.

During the Swahili Colloquium, we will pay tribute to an excellent scholar, who has contributed much to Swahili scholarship and passed away recently, namely, Elena Bertoncini Zúbková.
